The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA), in collaboration with states and territories, has developed agreed Australian curriculum for English, Mathematics, Science and History. Each of these learning areas includes content statements that represent essential learning for all Australian students.

When will the new syllabuses incorporating Australian Curriculum be taught in NSW?

Thank you to all of our staff and helpers involved in the organisation of this excellent HEADSTART program.

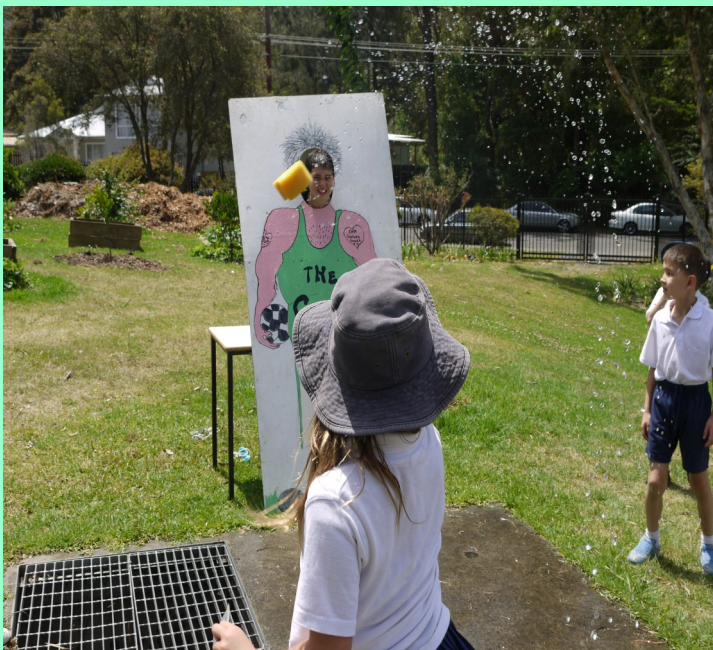
SUNSAFE AND PROUD

OLD QUARRY REZONING

Dear Parents and Teachers,

Springfield's Community needs your help to stop this proposal to rezone the old quarry at the top of Clarence Rd to be used as a Resource Recovery Facility (concrete and road base crushing and green waste storage site).

This facility will be in an elevated and high wind area, within close proximity to Chertsey Public School and other schools, daycare centers and our houses. This is a residential area!

The Gosford Council Proposal is at http://www.gosford.nsw.gov.au/exhibition/base_view

If you were not at the urgent meeting called last week to discuss this proposal, 150 – 200 concerned residents attended. There was much discussion of the negative effects of this and the possible health and safety risks, and also of the possibility of other industry buying this land further down the track and setting up a variety of alternatives once the area has been rezoned.

We now only have 9 days to write our letters to Gosford Council. 9 days to make a difference.

To stop this proposal going ahead - we must stop the quarry site being rezoned.

Write your submission letter quoting the reference number of the proposal (10577893) and state all your own concerns. Address it to The Mayor and General Manager of Gosford City Council.

Your letter must be submitted by **5pm Nov 28** or it will not be considered.

Inform all your family and friends of the facebook site and ask them to view the information and sign the petition, or even write their own letters.

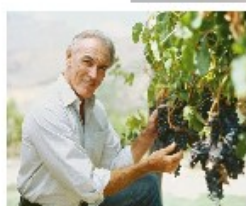

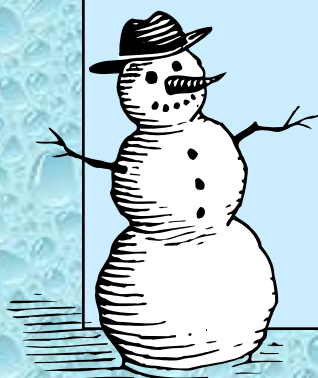

Screen time and physical activity

The Australian government recommends school kids participate in moderate to vigorous activity for at least one hour a day. Screen time (including TV, computer and electronic games) should be limited to less than two hours a day. As parents it can often be difficult to tear kids away from their beloved TV or computer.

Here are a few tips to reduce screen time and increase physical activity:

- Eat as a family with the TV off
- Make bedrooms 'screen free zones'
- Be a role model. Exercise regularly and minimise your own screen time
- Create a diary of screen time – you may be surprised just how much it adds up to each day. Challenge your family to reduce their screen time across the week
- Set a two hour a day limit on screen time and stick to it
- Don't leave the TV on in the background at home
- Don't use TV as a reward or punishment, as it increases its worth to kids
- In the afternoons, encourage kids to:
 - Play hide and seek, tag, 'stuck in the mud' or other running games
 - Play sports or take up a hobby
 - Try arts and crafts
 - Read or play board games
 - Help cook a healthy meal

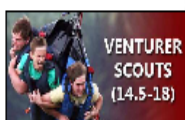
