The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 27 August and 26 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

We will be inviting the students from years 4, 5 and 6 to complete this survey over the next few weeks and then we will have a link for parents to follow to also complete the survey.

Headstart kicks off this week with our first of ten sessions with our Kindergarten students for 2019. On Thursday September 13 we will hold our teddy bears picnic. All of our staff are very excited to meet our future students and welcome them into our lovely school.

As of week 2 Term 4 I will be moving across to Kariong Public School as the Relieving Principal for Term 4 and Term 1, 2019 with a possibility of extension. ### Keeping safe around school crossings

For your child's safety, it's very important to ensure they use the school crossing.

At all crossings you must wait on the footpath, at least one step back from the edge of the road.

If there's a School Crossing Supervisor, wait until they have stopped the traffic and called you to cross.



If you are driving, you must not proceed until the School Crossing Supervisor's hand-held sign is no longer displayed, or until the crossing supervisor indicates that you may proceed through the crossing.

#### Children's crossings

Children's crossings are usually part-time crossings that operate before and after school hours. They can also operate at other times when children use the crossing for excursions or during break times. When 'Children Crossing' flags are displayed, you must stop at the white line if pedestrians are waiting to cross. Drivers must remain stationary until the crossing is clear of pedestrians.



#### BECOME A WAMBERAL SURF LIFE SAVER

A surf life saver is a trained volunteer that patrols our beach on the weekends. Becoming a surf life saver is satisfying, fun and rewarding. You can:

• Lead a fit and healthy lifestyle

- · Become trained in aquatic safety skills
  - Make new friends
  - Compete in surf sports
- Give something back to your local community

You may also help save someone's life one day!

The Surf Rescue Certificate is a stepping stone to the full Bronze Medallion that is generally the minimum standard required for full patrolling duties. The Surf Rescue Certificate is for people aged between 13 and 15 years

The Bronze Medallion course provides participants (15 years and up) with the skills and knowledge of patrolling and surf awareness in order to be able to participate in lifesaving operations.

Our Life Savers volunteer 5-10 hours a month during summer patrolling the beach.
