Expression of Interest

During terms two & three we would like to commence a 'Seasons for Growth' Program at our School. 'Seasons for Growth' is a Loss and Grief Support Program. It does not provide counselling and therapy. The aim is to support young people to understand and manage the grief that is experienced through the loss of a parent or significant other in death, separation or divorce. 'Seasons for Growth' assists in normalising the emotions associated with the loss.

Trained Companions (leaders) work with a group of no more than six children in each group and work through the program that encourages the expression of thoughts and emotions and develops an essential peer support network for your child. The program is divided into 3 groups, level 1, 2 & 3 for ages 6-8, 9-10, 11-12 respectfully. The sessions run for 30-40 minutes per week for eight weeks during school time and conclude with a group celebration.

When considering this program it is very important that your child shows an interest to be involved and that the loss experienced is not currently overwhelming. (Please speak with Miss Donna if you are unsure of what this means). If you are interested in finding out more information about this program, please fill in the form below and return it to me, via the office.

An information session for parents/carers will be held prior to the starting of the course to further explain the concepts and practicalities of the program.
