
Headstart

Being Respectful

To all teachers that visit and teach at Chertsey Primary school

Be Respectful

- Look and listen to the teacher. Always listen to the teacher on your class and follow ALL instructions respectfully.
- Inside voices. Communicate calmly and maintain a calm and quiet classroom when learning.
- Say please and thank you. Always use friendly and respectful talk with all teachers that teach your class.
- Pay attention and cooperate. In classroom and playground lessons with all teachers.

Be Responsible

- Right place, right time. Always be safe when at school and go directly to the teacher on your class during learning time and when called.
- **Be honest**. Try your best in class and on the playground, follow the rules and be respectful to all teachers who teach your class.
- Stay with your class. Show all teachers who teach your class the class rules and behaviour expectations.
- Represent Chertsey positively. Display our Chester values to all teachers that teach and visit at our school.

Be Your Best

- Be ready to learn. Be prepared, have what you need and be eager to learn from all teachers.
- **Be an active participant**. Participate in all class and school activities with a keen, respectful and positive attitude
- **Keep yourself calm.** Use your mindfulness skills when you need them and let teachers know what Zone you are in and how they can help you.
- Get along with others. Always show respectful behaviour and communication to all teachers on your class
