From the Principal's Desk

Kindergarten 2021

As advised in last fortnight's newsletter, all Kindergarten transition programs across the state are to remain on hold. If we were not in the midst of a pandemic, by this stage of Term 3, we would have already begun our 10 Week Kindergarten HeadStart program. We have started creating our virtual HeadStart introduction and are waiting for the video to be finalised so that we can upload it onto our School Stream app, website and Facebook. We will be creating some HeadStart videos to make up for the 5 weeks of HeadStart that we have been unable to commence. We will keep you up to date of any changes to our HeadStart program via our app, newsletter, website and Facebook.



As we are beginning to plan for 2021, we need to finalise our Kindergarten enrolment application forms as soon as possible to ensure that no one misses out on information regarding HeadStart. If you have not enrolled your child at Chertsey or you know of school aged children, please contact the school office as soon as possible. Our friendly office staff can take your details and we can then keep you informed and up to date with all of the latest information regarding Kindergarten 2021 and HeadStart.

<u>2021</u>

Term 4 is a very busy time for schools as we are gearing up to the end of year celebrations particularly for our Year 6 students who will mark the end of their seven year primary education journey. We are also in the planning stages for allocating student numbers and classes. If your child will not be attending Chertsey next year, please contact the office as soon as possible.

Afternoon Pick Up

In every school, the end of the day pick up is one of the busiest transition times and Chertsey is no different. Students and parents are always eager to go to the next activity in the day or head home for some down time. It is so vitally important that every parent is vigilant in following the road and street signs that are displayed by the RMS (Roads and Maritime Services) to ensure the safety of all members of the public. Willow Road and Bilgola Close are both busy roads at this time. What is concerning is that I have had parents and community members report of cars that are at a standstill on the corner of Avalon Road and Bilgola Close trying to enter to pick up their child. This has resulted in other cars having to drive on the opposite side of the road so they can continue with their journey. If you are trying to enter the close and it is full, please continue your drive turning left onto Wells Street and around the block. Staff are on duty at the back gate and if any child has not been picked up after ten minutes, children are brought to the administration block to continue our supervision until a parent/carer has arrived.

Can you please encourage your children to listen and follow to staff instructions when leaving the school site. Staff are giving instructions so that all children are safe on their way to you. It may result in a few minutes longer however the near misses with students we have had recently are evidence that all of us, students, parents/carers and community members need to be cautious and follow the road and safety rules. Schools have a duty of care to ensure the safety of students and we need your involvement to keep them safe.

Bilgola Close and Staff Carpark

We are currently observing a number of native birds swooping the Bilgola Close entry pedestrian pathway area. If your child is frightened of birds it would be best to drop off at the Willow Street entrance until the breeding season is over (roughly at the end of October).

School Holidays

This Friday is our last school day for Term 3. School and classes return on Monday 12th October. The Term 4 Calendar has been attached to this newsletter however please take note of the highlighted events. The highlighted events are subject to the Department of Education guidelines as their NSW response to COVID therefore please take note of all communication so that you are not disappointed.

<u>Seesaw</u>

This year, all classes at Chertsey Primary School have joined Seesaw. Seesaw is an app designed to share student work with students, teachers and families. For families, this allows you to gain further insight into your child's learning and school happenings.

Recently classes have sent home parent logins so that families can connect to Seesaw and view some of your child's work at school. Please note that your child's class may not post work on Seesaw daily as this is only one way that we collect samples of your child's work. Also, while teachers may from time to time share class reminders or updates through Seesaw, parent contact though Seesaw is not encouraged as teachers may not be regularly checking the app for messages. It is preferred that parents contact teachers via a phone call to the front office or a letter directly to the classroom teacher. Teachers will endeavour to respond to any parent messages sent via Seesaw within 48 hours.

Chaplaincy at Chertsey with Miss Donna

This term we have focused on supporting children by running small groups such as:

Seasons for Growth is an innovative, evidence-based change, loss and grief education program that draws on the metaphor of the seasons to understand the experience of grief. It builds the knowledge and skills necessary to strengthen social and emotional wellbeing following significant loss by:

- Exploring the impact of change and loss
- Learning about effective ways to respond and adapt

Participants learn that they are not alone in their experience of change, loss and grief, and are able to build their communication, decision making and problem solving skills within the context of a safe and supportive peer group learning environment.

Sibworks program for young primary school aged with siblings of children with disability or chronic illness have particular needs themselves. Some can feel quite isolated. Sibling groups allow these children to come together, have fun, share experiences and learn ways of dealing positively with challenges they face.

Shine is a unique personal development and group-mentoring tool that uses an inspirational, practical and experiential approach to learning for girls to discover who they are and the person they want to become.

These group have been a valuable resource to our students and their families and I have received excellent feedback from parents.

Vacation Care Program Oct 2020

<u>COVID-19</u> - As you are aware the World Health Organisation has declared COVID-19 a pandemic. The situation in regard to COVID-19 continues to evolve with an increasing number of countries having sustained community transmission. In Australia the majority of COVID-19 cases are returning travellers or close contacts of cases, but there is evidence of limited community transmission in some states including NSW. As this is an evolving situation, the recommendations are changing rapidly.

We at WOOSH Care take the health and safety of all our children, families and staff very seriously and follow the directions given by the Education Department. This may mean that at any time our program may be changed or

even cancelled.

Sun Safety: CHOOSH Care endorses the Cancer Council's 'Sun Safe OOSH' Policy. Under this policy, a daily UV check is conducted, and at times where the UV level is above 3, SPF 50 sunscreen is applied every 2-3 hours. Children are also required to wear sun safe clothing, including a broad brimmed, bucket style or legionnaire hat, and clothing which covers their shoulders. Singlets and caps are not sun safe clothing. If your child attends Vacation Care without appropriate sun safe clothing, they will be provided with a hat/ shirt. Children must also wear sensible shoes for walking and playing (i.e. enclosed shoes or strap-on sandals), and bring a jumper or a jacket and drink bottle each day. Thongs and slip-on style shoes are not permitted. <u>Caps are not permitted at CHOOSH Care</u>



Hand-held video games: Children are permitted to bring their hand-held games during Vacation Care, but specific times will be allocated for playing their games so that they spend some time participating in other activities. All games, including IPod games, must be G or PG rated as per centre policy. Any games above this classification (M, MA15+) will be confiscated and returned to the child's parent/ guardian at the completion of the day. CHOOSH Care is not responsible for any breakages or lost property. <u>Children are not permitted to use mobile phones at CHOOSH Care at any time</u>.

Hours of operation: CHOOSH Care is open from 6.30am till 6.00pm Monday to Friday during the school holidays and Pupil Free Days (excludes public holidays). Bookings are essential as places are limited.

Supervision: CHOOSH Care is approved for a maximum of 40 school age children per day, however limitations may be placed on maximum number of enrolments due to staffing or transport requirements. Staff to child ratios of 1:15 are maintained during centre days, with increased supervision on excursions. A *Risk Assessment* is conducted prior to each excursion and are available for parents to view upon request. A *Responsible Person* holding their Apply First Aid, Child Protection, Asthma & Anaphylaxis certificate will be rostered on at all times throughout the day. A photograph of the Responsible Person on duty is displayed at the sign in desk.

Payment: The cost per day for in-centre activities is \$54 per child for permanent enrolments, and \$58 for casual enrolments. The cost per day for excursions is \$64 for permanent enrolments, and \$68for casual enrolments. Please note that additional costs may apply to some 'in centre' activities and excursions,

particularly swimming excursions to cover increased staffing costs. (Please see the program for these additional charges). Note: Permanent enrolments are those families who attend before and/or after school care and have paid a bond and registration fee.

Bookings: Bookings can be returned to CHOOSH Care via email or in person. *Please note: Verbal bookings will not be accepted.* Bookings must be received by <u>Wednesday 23rd September.</u> In the case that a day becomes booked out, a waiting list will be prepared and parents will be notified if a place becomes available.

Child Care Subsidy (CCS): CCS is available to registered parents for Vacation Care. Please contact Family Assistance Office (FAO) on 136 150 to be CCS assessed.

Cancellations: Please notify the Centre of any cancellations as soon as possible. There are no refunds once a booking is made, but it may be possible to swap places for another day <u>within the same week</u> as long as there is a vacancy on the desired day.

Red Hat/ Shirt surcharge: During excursions, children are provided with red shirts to ensure children are easily identifiable. Children are also provided with sun safe red hats if they do not have an appropriate hat on any day. To cover cost of purchasing, embroidering and laundering these shirts, a surcharge of \$5 per child per Vacation Care will be added to your Family Statement.

CHOOSH Care's Vacation Care Program: We are aware that sometimes programmed activities will not appeal to all children. Be assured that wherever possible we try to provide alternative activities such as craft, games or movies. There are also opportunities for children to assist with activities even if they do not wish to take part in the actual activity.

Program variations: The Vacation Care program is subject to change without notice if it is deemed in the best interests of children. E.g. changes to program on wet weather days. Should an excursion change, parents will be required to sign their permission for the new excursion prior to child attending.

Medication: If your child requires medication an *Administration of Medication* form must be completed on each day that the medication is to be administered. Please note that no over-the-counter medication will be given (except Panadol - see booking form). Medication must be provided in original packaging with the child's correct name and will be administered as per dosage instructions.

Food: Please pack a nutritious morning tea, lunch and some snacks for your children on all days. Afternoon tea is provided and **lunch is provided only on some days** (see program for days where lunch is provided). Water will be freely available at the Centre, but please supply a drink bottle for excursions as these can be refilled as required. Please ensure that your child has adequate food, as Vacation Care days are active and long and the children do get quite hungry.

Nut policy: CHOOSH Care endeavours to be a 'nut free' centre, as per policy, for the safety of all children. Please do not send any nuts or food products containing nuts to CHOOSH Care.

Breakfast: Breakfast is provided between 6:30am – 7:30am during Vacation Care. Breakfast options include wholemeal toast, weetbix, cheerios, cornflakes, rice bubbles and plain milk or milo.

Special diets: If children are on restricted diets due to food allergies etc. parents are advised to provide alternatives food for their child as we cannot guarantee that the foods available will be suitable for your child's needs.

Spending money: Children are not permitted to bring money for an excursion unless the program indicates otherwise as there is no opportunity for them to spend it.
