Every year schools are required to assess themselves against a standard of achievement called the School Excellence Framework (SEF) and from this year forward, every school goes through a process called External Validation (EV). Last term, our annual assessment was completed which saw Chertsey maintain as well as improve in several areas. By the end of week 9 this term, we submit our evidence for external validation. External validation is as the title suggests, where we are rated or validated against the SEF by department employees that are external to Chertsey. The process prior to submission is labour and time intensive. Our EV meeting is early Term 3, after which I will be able to share our success and where to next with you.
